For the year ended 31 March 2020

Basis of Preparation

Glaucoma New Zealand has elected to apply Tier 3 PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Glaucoma New Zealand is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Limited Scope Audit

Glaucoma NZ has defined the scope of this audit to include the financial parts of the Performance Report only.

Opinion

I have audited the financial aspects of the Performance Report of Glaucoma New Zealand, a Charitable Trust and registered Charity, for the year ended 31 March 2020. These statements include the Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows, Statement of Accounting Policies and the Notes.

In my opinion the Performance Report provides a true and fair view of the financial activities of Glaucoma New Zealand for the year ended 31 March 2020 and their financial position at that date in accordance with the financial reporting framework for registered Charities.

No opinion is expressed on any other information included in the Performance Report that is outside the scope reported above.

My audit was completed on 21 September 2020 and my opinion is expressed as at that date.

Basis for Opinion

I have been guided by New Zealand auditing standards ISA(NZ) in performing this audit in as much as they are applicable to small not-for-profit entities. The auditor's responsibilities with respect to such audits can be accessed here:

An audit involves collecting and examining evidence that the information presented in the Performance Report correctly represents the actual financial activities and position of the organisation to a high degree of certainty and accuracy.
