

Glaucoma New Zealand

Glaucoma NZ is a non-government-funded registered charitable trust established in 2002 to eliminate blindness from glaucoma.

It is the only service in New Zealand specifically for people with glaucoma providing credible and accurate information, support, and education to people living with or caring for someone with glaucoma.

GNZ Membership, information and services are free.

Glaucoma NZ aims to eliminate blindness from glaucoma through:

Enhancing public awareness about glaucoma

Supporting and informing people with glaucoma

Participating in education of health professionals involved in glaucoma care

Supporting research into glaucoma in NZ

What is Glaucoma?

Glaucoma is the name given to a group of eye diseases where the optic nerve at the back of the eye is slowly destroyed. The nerve fibres progressively die, first removing the peripheral (side) vision

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Glaucoma is the leading cause of preventable blindness in New Zealand. It is estimated that over 100,000 New Zealanders currently have glaucoma, with 50% unaware they have it.

If glaucoma is detected early enough, treatment can prevent progression and preserve eyesight.

Although older people are at a higher risk for glaucoma, people of all ages, including babies and young adults, can get glaucoma.
